The main results and findings

Simply put, color is the perception of the colored rays that fall on the human eye.

One cannot always like one color. Depending on how he changes his mood, grows up, changes his character, his feelings, his favorite color may change to a different color. Color, along with light and shadow, forms the basis of painting. Just as we cannot imagine poetry without words or music without sound, so we cannot imagine painting without color. As each artist works on his or her work, he or she can effectively express the diversity not only in nature, but in the entire universe, by making effective

use of certain limited colors in his or her palette. In doing so, he achieves image expressiveness not by directly copying objects in nature, but by correctly capturing the relationship of colors between objects and the environment in which they are located.
